How You Feed Hay This Winter Matters

With a shortage of standing forage for cattle and the low availability of hay, it is more important than ever this winter to reduce waste when feeding hay.

Hay waste is normal, but it can be controlled and minimized, said University of Missouri Extension agronomy specialist Tim Schnakenberg.

There can be considerable loss when livestock producers feed large round or square hay bales, Schnakenberg said in a university news release. Research shows losses from improper feeding can be as high as 40%, depending on how hay is presented to the cows, he said. Feeding losses may be more typically around 10% to 20%, but a 20% loss can make a \$60 bale of hay cost \$72 by the time it is fed.

Some believe hay can make great bedding for cattle and calves during cold weather. While true, it makes for some very expensive bedding, Schnakenberg said. Even poor-quality hay this year was expensive to roll up.

"There are several methods producers can use to minimize losses when feeding round bales," said Schnakenberg.

At the very least, use a bale ring to restrict full access to the hay and minimize cattle stomping on hay and making bedding out of it. In one MU study, using

rings kept losses to about 5% whether feeding a one-day supply or a seven-day supply of hay. Rings or racks are crucial for producers who do not choose to feed cattle on a daily basis, he said.

"Be sure to purchase enough rings so all cows can eat at the same time," Schnakenberg said. "If you have 50

having a sheeting ring around the base made a huge difference in all cases.

While cone feeders are much more expensive, they can be worth it in the long run, Schnakenberg said.

"If you can drop hay losses 8-15%, that extra cost starts to be made up in hay remaining for cow consumption,"

he said. "These feeders also have a longer life, support heavier bales and have been found to keep cattle from pulling hay off the top and dragging it into the mud. Since they have a longer life, you can spread the investment of that feeder out over more animals."



cows and your rings have 10 spaces for feeding, five rings are needed. If you do not have adequate space, the aggressive cows crowd out the timid cows, forcing them to eat lower-quality hay."

The type of feeder can make a big difference in the degree of hay loss. Studies on types of ring feeders by MU, Oklahoma State University and Michigan State University found very similar results when feeding grass hay. In the MU study, an open-bottom ring feeder resulted in a 20% loss of hay. A sheeted-bottom ring feeder had a 13% loss, and a cone feeder resulted in only a 5% loss. The studies found that

One of the best ways to reduce losses is to feed hay in small amounts. This gives cattle less opportunity to trample hay and make it unappealing for consumption. This requires calculations of how much hay per animal is needed, factoring in potential losses associated with your feeding method.

There are some who will unroll hay every day or even twice a day, making cows finish all the hay before they get more. This is the most efficient way to feed hay, but it takes more labor.

Bale unrollers are quite popular, and some producers use bale choppers that leave windrows of hay on the ground. These approaches work well for distributing manure around the farm by moving the hay feeding to different locations each day. The practice also allows both aggressive and timid cows to eat together more efficiently. The losses can vary greatly from farm to farm depending on how this practice is done.

"If producers use these methods, it is imperative to not feed more hay than your cows can consume in a day," Schnakenberg said. Otherwise, hay losses may be more than 40%, according

to one MU study. In this case, seven days of hay was unrolled. In comparison, daily amounts fed at one time results in about a 12% loss in that study.

Finally, it's important to feed in a well-drained area. A pad or an elevated surface for feeding is best.

"It has been determined that cow body condition can begin to drop in 8 inches or more of mud," Schnakenberg said. "The most recommended way is to move the feeding area around the farm to better distribute manure and minimize excess mud."




of the Heartland Limousin Association, and a member of the North American Limousin Foundation. Norma received the North Dakota Soil Conservation Achievement Award in 1981.





Fullblood Limousin Association



Supplement Needs Vary by Region

Many start their day with a multivitamin to supplement their diet in hopes of being as healthy as possible, in much the same way, mineral supplementation can overcome deficiencies in the grasses that cattle graze, said the experts at Kansas State University's Beef Cattle Institute.

Speaking on a Cattle Chat podcast, the beef cattle experts stressed the importance of minerals in a grazing animal's diet.

"Cattle get the majority of their nutrition from forages, and the quality of what they are grazing will vary widely depending on the maturity of the grass and season of the year," veterinarian Bob Larson said.

In addition, nutritionist Philip Lancaster said different forage species will have varied mineral concentration.

"Across the country, there is a variation in soil types and the ability of plants to take up the minerals from the soil as well as the concentration of the minerals within the soil," Lancaster said.

Because of that variation, Larson said it is important to consult with local experts to know how to optimally

supplement mineral to the animals.

"Good trace mineral nutrition is local, and there are experts in the area that can recommend the mineral package that you need," Larson said, adding that forages will vary widely in the trace mineral concentrations of copper, zinc, manganese, and selenium.

Another factor in creating a mineral supplement plan is where the cow is at in her production cycle. Larson said lactating cows will have a greater nutritional demand than non-lactating females.

"If we look at the cow's requirement, the goal needs to be to supplement as close to that requirement as possible by matching it up with the local forages," Lancaster said. "In a lot of instances we are over-supplementing and that can cause an antagonistic effect."

The animal's body is less likely to use the mineral because of the influence of the other minerals.

"There are a number of things in the diet that can cause antagonisms, so it is important to do the work of optimizing the minerals and not assuming that more is better," Larson said.

Potential Impacts of a Long Hard Drought on the Subsequent Calving Season

Drought across the Great Plains has greatly reduced the supply of grass available this grazing season. While many cows went to market to save grass for a core herd, those cows that remain may have had access to limited, dry pastures. Grass in many areas appeared dormant as early as July. Therefore, not only was quantity limiting, but quality may have been limiting as well.

Normally, in a year with adequate rainfall, cows are able to replenish liver stores of vitamins and mineral that they may need to use during the winter. Additionally, they may be able to improve body condition either during summer grazing or at least in the fall after weaning if they have an opportunity to graze forages that were deferred during the growing season. In a drought, and especially the second year of a drought, reserve forages are likely unavailable and summer grazing may have been limited.

This could result in bred cows in a body condition score (BCS) of 4 or less on a 1-9 scale, when a 5 or 6 would be optimal, and liver stores of minerals and vitamins lower than normal.

There are several potential problems for thin cows in this drought scenario. One concern is that if cows are forced to use body reserves throughout the winter, due to harsh weather and/or limited feed reserve, they are in danger of becoming weak, possibly too weak to be mobile. Additionally, as a thin cow uses reserves to maintain herself rather than put those reserves into the development of the fetus, she is at risk of giving birth to a small weak calf that will struggle in the adverse weather conditions generally associated with spring calving.

Colostrum is the first meal a newborn calf

receives. This is a very important meal because it is rich in immunoglobulins, vitamin A, protein, and fat, all of which are instrumental in building immunity and giving the calf a nutrient dense meal important for a healthy start. These nutrients all drop to a fraction of the values found in colostrum within 48 hours of milk production, so it really is extremely important that the colostrum be high quality and the calf be strong enough to stand and consume it shortly after birth.

Research has shown cows in a BCVS 4 have decreased immunoglobulin concentration compared to cows in a BCVS 5 or 6. Vitamin A, readily available in green grass, is stored in the liver and can be pulled from the liver to produce colostrum, which starts about 5 weeks prior to calving.

Vitamin A is also very important for immunity in the calf. However, not all the needed Vitamin A comes from the liver, the diet must provide Vitamin A as well. Therefore, if the grass was low in Vitamin A due to drought conditions, and the cows are currently low-quality harvested feeds, the colostrum is at risk of being low in Vitamin A.

Cows who are a BCS 4 at calving, and faced with the nutrient demands of lactation may struggle to rebreed. This is especially true of first and second calf heifers who still have to allocate nutrients for growth.

If cows have access to green grass shortly after calving and before the breeding season begins, they have a better chance of rebreeding early enough to maintain a 365-day calving interval. However, harvested feed reserves may be limited, and if drought conditions persist, cows may need additional feed resources to rebreed.




