Darron And Jeannie Uhl Named NALF "Commercial Producer Of The Year"



arron and Jeannie Uhl of Battle Creek, Iowa, were selected as the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF) Commercial Producer Of The Year for 2023. The award was presented at the NALF Award Ceremony and Genetics On Ice Benefit Auction January 1, 2024 in conjunction with the Cattlemen's Congress in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

The Uhls have been farming, feeding cattle and operating a cow herd since 1996. They run a 200-head Anguscrossbred commercial cow herd and feed 1,000 head annually. Over the

years, the operation has grown to about 2,000 crop acres.

In addition to their own home-raised calves, they also purchase Limousin-cross calves. The Uhls purchase their bulls from Leonard Limousin of Holstein, Iowa.

They market their home-raised calves at 1,500 lbs. at 16 months of age. They strive to hit a Yield Grade 1, Choice with 65-66% yield. Feed conversion is a major consideration, and they only purchase bulls that have feed conversion of at least a 5 lbs. to 1 lb. (grain to gain). They also select bulls with an YWT EPD higher

than 130 and an actual ribeye at 12 months larger than 16". They sell directly to Cargill in Schuyler, Nebraska. All of the calf crop is sold as finished cattle, mostly on the grid.

The Uhls strive to maintain 95% of the calf crop that will weigh over 700 lbs. at seven months of age. In the next few years, they will try to expand their home-raised herd to 300 cows because their two sons are interested in joining the operation.

The number one priority for Darron is weaning weight plus final harvest weight. They are cognizant of docility as the behavior of the calf contributes to higher weight gain. Darron said Limousin bulls have always been easy to work with, and in his 30 years using Limousin bulls, they have never experienced a bull with a bad attitude. The Uhl family relies on detailed records for analysis in determining their following year's herd goals and improvements.

Darron is a member of the Iowa and Ida County Cattlemen's Association, and he has served in various service positions within their church. The Uhls were nominated for this prestigious award by Mark Leonard, Leonard Limousin of Holstein, Iowa, and the Iowa Limousin Association. Congratulations to Darron and Jeannie Uhl!





Iowa Presents "Commercial Producer" Award to Darin Scheer



Darin Scheer of Mapleton, IA, ILA "Commercial Producer of the Year", received a plaque and jacket from Paul Millhollin, ILA president, at the Iowa Beef Expo sale.

Darin Scheer of Mapleton, Iowa, was named by the Iowa Limousin Association (ILA) as their "Commercial Producer of the Year". They were presented with a plaque during the Iowa Beef Expo Limousin Show February 11, 2024, at the state fairgrounds in Des Moines.

He has been working with cattle since he was a young boy in the 1980s, helping select Limousin bulls with his father. Darin currently runs 100 cows in a fall-calving herd and 100 cows in a spring-calving herd. He does this to get double usage from his high-performance herd sires.

Darin also purchases 70-100 bred heifers each spring, calves them out and sells them bred to Limousin bulls after weaning. Darin's operation is unique because he raises his calves preweaning and breeds cows all in a confinement hoop building. After calving, the pairs go into the hoop building where they stay until weaning time and the cows are bred back.

The spring-calving cows then graze on corn stalks until calving begins. The fall-calving cows run on pasture in the summer and enter the hoop building after the spring-calving cows go on stalks. The hoop building works to the benefit of the fall-born calves, helping to avoid the performance reduction typically seen in fall calves in the north. He expects to double his cow numbers over time.


herd. Paul and Darla raised six children who were active in the beef industry, raising, showing and selling cattle.




They were nominated for this award by the South Dakota Limousin Association and Peterson's L7 Bar Limousin of Pukwana, South Dakota.

The Randalls have used Limousin bulls on their herd of commercial cattle since 1977 after watching Limousin calves grow in their neighbor's pasture. They always feed out their cattle so the higher dressing percentage and reduced number of yield grade fours and fives impressed them. In addition to using Limousin bulls, they purchased a set of higher percentage Limousin cows and formed Triple R Limousin. In addition to feeding out their production, they sold a few bulls to neighbors and used their bulls themselves.

As their farming and feeding operation grew, and Limousin bulls became more available, they reduced their registered herd and began to devote their time to feeding more commercial cattle. Today, the Triple R Feeders operation has developed into 1,300 commercial cows and a 4,500-head feedlot.

Two sons have joined the feeding program that includes custom silage cutting and other agricultural related entities. They are always looking for Limousin cattle that will meet their goals of high cutability and feed efficiency.

South Dakota Producers Featured in Papers

Two South Dakota producers were featured in newspapers in December and January. An article about the Petersen Ranch of Eagle Butte was printed in the December 27th issue of *The Cattle Business Weekly* and an article about Ludens Family Limousin of Viborg was published in the January 27th copy of the *Tri-State Livestock News*.

Petersen

The Petersen family roots run deep in South Dakota. The family: Arden and his wife, Lori, son Cole and his wife, Carleyn, raise Limousin cattle. Cole said that his grandpa, Raymond, got into the breed in the early '70s. "We like their meat. We are used to seeing 16-inch ribeyes," Cole said. "They are good mothers."

Ribeye size, milk production and ability to protect their young from predators are what the family selects for each generation. In addition to the cow/calf herd, the family raises feedstuffs: wheat, alfalfa, oats and millet. The past two years were difficult due to the drought.

"I like to get to see my calves grow up and turn into breeding heifers and then cows," Cole explained. "I feel like life on a ranch is a good way to raise a family."

Ludens

The Ludens family has been exhibiting cattle at the Black Hills Stock Show for the past 36 years. Gordy took over the family place 48 years ago. His grandchildren are now the sixth generation on the farm, located near Viborg.

In 1981, Gordy bought his first Limousin bull from a dispersal sale in Huron, SD. He worked to build up the herd, and in 1988, he entered his first cattle in the BHSS. In 2020, Ludens Family Limousin exhibited a bull that went on to be selected *Supreme* Champion at the BHSS. "The Black Hills Stock Show is like a reunion every year," said Mike, their son. The Ludens family have also taken bulls to the National Western Stock Show in Denver, Colorado.

Gordy and his wife, Pam, hosted their first bull sale in 1991 after selling a few bulls private treaty. They now run the farm and cattle operation with their son, Mike, and his wife, Sarah, and their four children.






